Reminder Fireworks Are Illegal In Corona

The City of Corona would like to remind everyone that it is illegal to possess, discharge or sell fireworks. Residents should adhere to the "no fireworks" law throughout the City of Corona (Corona Municipal Code 9.33.010-9.33.030). Citations for violations of the City Ordinance banning fireworks will be issued to those possessing "Safe and Sane" fireworks; the fine is \$500.00 The fine for possession of other types of fireworks (those not certified "Safe & Sane") is \$1000.00.
